### Use Our Convenient Drop-Off and Pick-Up Zones!

## It's Time for Parent-Teacher-Student Conferences!



Where has this year gone? As we wrap up 2018, we also wrap up the 1<sup>st</sup> trimester of school—with parent/teacher/student conferences beginning Thursday, November 29 and concluding on Friday, December 7. We will be on minimum day schedule during these 7 days of conferences. I want to thank all families for making this commitment to come to school, meet with the teacher and your child(ren) to learn more about his/her progress.

This is an important time for you to discuss your child's progress in school. Often, busy schedules limit the time that parents and teachers can share information, so making the most of opportunities, such as conferences,

becomes even more important. Below is some information that will help you in preparing for your parentteacher-student conference. Parents do not need to sign in at the office during non-instruction time.

#### Preparing for the Conference:

• Talk with your child before the conference. Find out what they think are their best and worst subjects. Why? Ask your child if there is anything they would like you to talk about with their teacher.

• Make sure your child does not worry about the meeting. Help them understand that the meeting is designed to help them do better in school. And remember, they need to be at the conference, too!

• Write notes before you go to remind yourself of what you want to talk about.

• If possible, have all parents attend. Each parent usually has a different take on the child and allows for you to hear the information at the same time.

• Arrange for a babysitter for small children.

• Your student should attend the conference.

#### Other Tips:

• Ask your most important questions first, just in case time is running short.

• Ask for clarification. Education has its own lingo; if you do not understand something, ask for an explanation.

Meeting with your child's teacher will build strong parent-teacher partnerships. We must work as partners to reach our common goal of helping your child receive the best education!

## School Arrival Time

A reminder students are not permitted on campus before 7:30am. We worry about our students arriving to school too early as there is no supervision for them on campus. At 7:30am, students go to the cafeteria for supervision and/or to eat breakfast. Consider the 4<sup>th</sup> R Program or other daycare options should you need to drop your child off at school prior to 7:30am. Please don't risk your child's safety or place the school in precarious situation.



Each Friday is Eagle Spirit and Pride Day. To show your Eagle Pride, simply wear blue or yellow/gold or your Golden Empire shirt on Friday! If you would like to purchase Eagle Wear, order forms are available in the school office. In-stock items will be sent home with your child within 2 days; items needing to be ordered may take a few weeks for delivery. GO EAGLES!!

#### **Medications in School**

The District and Golden Empire Staff recognize that students may have special medical needs. The Education Code (49407) outlines conditions for administering medications at school during the time the student is under the supervision of school personnel. Medication prescribed may be administered during the school day by designated school personnel. Medications, both prescription and overthe-counter, can only be given if there are written instructions from a health care provider and written permission from the parent/guardian. Upon request, a form will be provided to the parent for completion by the attending doctor and parent. Written instructions must be renewed at the start of each school year.

All prescription medications must:

•Be brought to school by the parent.

•Come in the original container with the prescription label attached.

#### <u>Asthma</u>

If your child requires use of an inhaler at school, whether it is used for emergencies or on a daily basis, it must be left in the office. This allows school personnel to monitor



and supervise all inhaler treatments and prevents the transporting of medication on the school bus or use in the classroom HOWEVER, if your doctor states that your child may keep the inhaler on his/her person, then we will accommodate this request. All inhalers require a medical authorization form.



It is extremely important that students are at school on time every school dav. Our curriculum challenging, is lessons are tightly spaced, and teaching moves very quickly. When students are absent, come to school late, or leave school early, the lessons they miss cannot be made up completely-their education, schoolwork, and test performance reflect the missed learning experience. (And our school funding is based on attendance!)

Please call our 24 hour attendance line at (916) 395-4580, option 1 to report your student's absence. You may also our electronic use absence form found on our website: goldenempire.scusd.edu. If s/he will be absent for more than a day call the school and have your child's teacher prepare a make-up packet. Please call by 12:00 pm and pick up no later than 3:30 from the school office. If your child will miss more than 1 week, inform us so we can prepare an individual study packet. Otherwise, you could be in jeopardy of your student being labeled as truant.

If you take your child to a medical appointment please be sure to get an office note to excuse his/her absence. You can also fax this note to us at (916) 228-5838.



What Is i-Ready? i-Ready is an interactive online learning program designed to provide individualized instruction based on each child's unique needs.

**i-Ready Diagnostic**: i-Ready starts with a test that determines every student's academic skills in math and reading. This test is adaptive, which means that the level of difficulty will change as your child answers each question. Questions get a little harder each time a question is answered correctly, and a little easier when answered incorrectly. The goal is to figure out the math or reading level that is "just right" for your child, so your child should expect to see some questions that are too hard–and that's okay! It means the test is working correctly.

The results of the test will help your child's teachers identify exactly where your child needs to develop, as well as where his or her strengths are. Teachers can use this information to design individualized instruction that meets the unique needs of your child. And because the test is taken a few times throughout the school year, your child's teacher will be able to measure progress and growth over the course of the year.

**i-Ready Instruction**: i-Ready provides students digital instruction that meets them where they are-at their level. It allows them to work independently on their own personalized online instruction plan, in lessons that are assigned based on the results from the i-Ready Diagnostic test.

Students complete the lessons in the computer lab or in their classroom. The lessons include three parts, consisting of a tutorial, quided practice, and a graded activity. This exciting format and engaging content students draws in right away. Students get supportive, real-time feedback on their progress in each skill; they see motivating messages and earn credits after completing lessons, which builds their investment in learning.



## Your Student Can Work on i-Ready at Home! Follow these steps:

- 1. Go to SCUSD.edu
- 2. Click on Parent/Student
- 3. Click on Online Tools
- 4. Click on Clever

#### There are 2 ways to sign in to i-Ready:

- 1. Log in with a Clever badge (Grades K-3 only): Click Clever, hold your badge up to the camera on your computer for this to work.
- Log in with Google (for all students\*): Use your student google account log-in (firstname-lastname@student.scusd.edu) and your password.

\*All students in grades 4-6 need to use their Google log-in which they should all know by now.



## Bringing the 7 Habits Home!

The Leader In Me at Golden Empire is our method to instill in our scholars, teachers, staff, and families the culture of personal and public leadership. The core of Leader In Me is the 7 Habits of Highly Effective People as outlined by Steven R. Covey. As the school year unfolds, the students will learn the language and meaning of the 7 Habits.

We encourage our families to complete a Habit at Home form, seen like this one, here. The forms can be found in the office periodically or are also sent home throughout the year. Parents complete the indicating how their child(ren) form demonstrated one (or more!) of the 7 Habits. Have your student return the form to school to receive a Golden Ticket and have their form displayed on our board in the main school hallway. It's rewarding and fun!

By hearing the same 7 Habit language at home and at school, we send the student leaders a strong message of what we believe is important and that we are all on the same team – the team that wants to help each student succeed. As the school and family connect in support of one another, our students will succeed beyond our wildest expectations! Thank you for teaming with us!
