Welcome to February! It is difficult to believe, but our school year is half over! The semester point is past, and we are on our way to spring. We are completing our second i-Ready diagnostic assessment period so we can see the growth of our students and use this data to make any adjustments needed to ensure our students are getting the best education possible. Our Spring Parent, Student, Teacher conferences will be March 15--22. You will be contacted by your child's teacher to set up a conference. These conferences are extremely important and we know everyone will make an effort to attend. As our Golden Empire students continue to progress we are excited and happy to share the news with you at conference time. However, please do not think that you need to wait until parent/teacher conferences to contact your child's teacher. If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to us!

The Golden Empire Faculty and Staff are committed to academic excellence for all students. We will do whatever it takes to help each child reach academic success! As our partner, we need your assistance to achieve this goal. Do you read to your child each night? No matter the age, all children benefit from hearing fluent readers. This exposes your child to quality literature that he/she may not be able to read and provides a special bonding time for you and your child. Just 15 minutes a night can make a world of difference!

You can also help by having your child arrive on time each day. There is a very high correlation between good attendance and good grades. Being punctual is an important life skill that kids can learn at an early age. This helps students begin their day on a positive note. We also need your help in reducing classroom interruptions. If you need to visit with the teacher, please do so before school, after school, or during the teacher's planning time. If your child forgets something, please leave it at the office, and we can have them pick it up at a convenient time. Please do not pick up your child early unless you cannot make other arrangements. Our students' learning time is precious, and as adults we need to show them that we respect what they are doing each day. Finally, if your child needs extra assistance, alert your child's teacher. We can assist with tutoring and/or intervention options.

It's time for Kindergarten registration! Registration began on January 15. If you have Kindergarten students or know anyone in our attendance area with Kindergarteners, make sure they enroll at the District's Enrollment Center, located at the Serna Center. Stop by the school office for more information. Register NOW to secure your child's place; our teachers and programs are in high demand!

When children are sick, they need to stay home. If your child has any of the following symptoms, please do not send him/her to school:

-Fever of 100 degrees or more: Children should stay home until the fever has been gone for 24 hours without fever reducing medication. -Vomiting or severe diarrhea: Children should stay home until symptoms have been gone for 24 hours.

-Severe cold: A little sniffle is not a reason to stay home, but a severe cold or influenza is.

-Severe sore throat, ear ache, head ache, or persistent cough: If your child has communicable disease, he/she should not Common come to school. childhood communicable diseases include chicken pox, measles, mumps and whooping cough (pertussis). Please call the school and let them know if your child should contract any of these diseases.

Mr. Lovrin's Library News: Are YOU Playing Library Bingo?

Just as there are many types of students at our school, we have many different types of books in our library. We try to make sure that every student has a chance to read the books that are of interest to them. We also strive to ensure that we have books with information for any report the students may need to work on. Having a wide collection of books to help our students have the tools necessary to become successful readers and leaders is essential.

In January we started Library Book Bingo for our 4th, 5th, and 6th grade students. The goal of this program is to get the students to read books from genres they may not normally read. In order to complete a bingo at least 6 books of different genres, which line up on the binao card, must be read and summarized. Students can earn individual prizes for a bingo, and another for a blackout. There will also be a school wide prize if enough students complete a bingo. Please continue to encourage your students reading both inside and outside of the school reading materials.

To get the younger classes interested in reading new genres, I am displaying more than just "everybody books" on the bookshelves. Sometimes students overlook non-fiction and chapter books because they are not as easily seen as some of the everybody books. 25 Questions That Get Kids Talking About School by Arianne Brill



Does this ever happen to you when your child comes home from school? You are just so curious about his/her day and you have lots of questions to ask, so you get started:

You say, "Hey! How was school today?" "Fine," your child says, already grabbing a book, tablet, snack, etc. And then the conversation is over.

Children actually love to talk about their day and what they are doing. Sometimes it just takes a little bit of prompting and creating a relaxed and welcoming environment to get the conversation going. Talking about school daily is a great opportunity for your child to know that you care about them. It also gives you important insights into any problems like bullying, school anxiety, friendship challenges and more.

It can get boring and even annoying for your child if you grill them every day on the details of what they did at school. While some children will happily open up, other children might need some encouragement, and questions can be a great way to get a conversation going. Keeping questions light and simple at first is a great way to simply have fun and enjoy each other.

Here you will find a mix of questions that are fun and open-ended. You'll also find some more serious questions to help you talk about tough topics like student conflict, anxiety and fears related to school.

1. What was your favorite part about school today?

2. What activity did you like the most today? And the least?

3. What did you think of the first assignment you had to do today?

4. If you could do any moment at school over today, what would it look like?

5. What was the funniest thing that happened in your class today?

6. Which assignment/activity did you feel most confident about today?

7. How is it going with your school activities and assignments?

8. What's the most interesting thing you heard at school today?

9. If you could change just ONE thing about school, what would that be?

10. What made you laugh/worry/smile in school today?

11. What 3 words would you use to describe your best friend in school?12. If you were stranded on a deserted island with one person from your school, who do you wish that would be? How come?

13. If you had \$1,000 to buy something for your school, what would you buy and where would you put it?

14. What qualities do you like most about your teacher?

15. What is something your teacher said to you today that you are still thinking about?

16. If you could put a spell on your teacher and change tomorrow's lesson, what would you make it all about?

17. Who did you play with/talk with at school today?

18. What is your best friend's favorite part of school? Is that the same for you or different?

19. If a famous person could come to teach a class at your school, who would it be and what should they teach?

20. What parts of school today went by the fastest? Slowest?

21. When I went to school there were some kids that were a bit mean, teasing and such...have you noticed anything like that at your school?

Talking to children about school gives you a really wonderful opportunity to discover how your child is doing, adjusting and learning. Taking this time to be together also helps you build a special bond of trust. Listening to your child in these early years is a great way to make sure your child feels comfortable and ready to talk to you about important things as they grow up.

If for some reason your child doesn't feel like talking, that's alright too. Some children need time to decompress after school before they are ready to get chatty. Follow your child's lead, strive to stay curious and willing to connect.

FAQs About Open Enrollment and Permits



Open Enrollment is an opportunity for each student who lives within the district boundaries to apply for enrollment in any participating school within the district. This allows parents to permanently select a school in which they want their child to attend. Open

Enrollment for the 2019-20 school year begins online at 8:00 a.m. on February 5, 2019 and continues through 5:00 p.m. on February 19, 2019. The online application will be available on the District's Open Enrollment webpage: www.scusd.edu.

Remember Open Enrollment is not a first-come, firstserve basis. You can apply for a school anytime during the enrollment period.

Walk-In dates for K-8th Grade Open Enrollment are available for families who do not have access to a computer or for parents who need assistance with translation. Translators will be available in Chinese, Hmong, Russian, Spanish, and Vietnamese. Walk-in Dates will take place at the SCUSD Enrollment Center (5601 47th Avenue, Sacramento, CA 95824).

Walk-in Dates as follows:

- Wed, 2/13/19 from 9:00am-3:00pm
- Thurs, 2/14/19 from 12:00-5:00pm
- Fri, 2/15/19 from 9:00-11:00am

A permit is available on an annual basis for parents to select a school that is not their "home school." Approval must be given by the non-home school principal. This may or may not happen depending on the schools' enrollment. If approval is given, a permit is then signed by the non-home school principal. Dr. Eister is always accepting permits for families who want their students at our school due to our excellent programs and high expectations for academics and behavior.

Golden Empire is always looking for new and prospective students who want to attend a high-achieving and demanding academic program. Kindergarten Registration for the 2019-20 school year began January 15. All kindergarten registration will be done centrally at the Serna Center. As class sizes continue to be stable at 24 students per class, classes will fill up quickly! Bring your child's shot records, birth certificate, and proof of address (SMUD, PG&E, or water bill). Children who will be 5 years old by September 1, 2019 are eligible for Kindergarten.



The staff parking lot is for staff members only. Families have been seen pulling into the parking lot to drop off or pick up students. The staff parking lot is not a place for students. Please help us in keeping our students

safe! Do not use the parking lot to drop off your students. Please do not park in the parking spaces, as there are not enough parking spaces for staff members. Thank you for your cooperation.

Keeping safety at the forefront Golden at Empire, remember to always sign-in at the front office before entering the school grounds during school



hours. Most of our families are well aware of this policy, but it is just a good reminder, as this policy is enforced by Penal Code 627.2. This regulation is to ensure our students and staff are always safe, and to ensure we always know who is on campus in case of an emergency. When you sign in, we will be asking you to wear a visitor's label showing that you have registered in the office. While this is not a new policy, we just have to remind everyone to take this extra step. We appreciate your help and understanding.
