






Bon Voyage

6th Grade GE Student Wins Poster Contest!

This past April, as part of Mosquito Awareness Week, the Sacramento-Yolo Mosquito and Vector Control District announced winners of the 2020 annual "Fight the Bite" Contest for students in grades K-12. In an effort to teach children about the importance of mosquito prevention, contest encouraged students to use art and submit a

drawing that promotes the Fight the Bite theme to inspire everyone to prevent mosquitoes by practicing key messages such as draining standing water and using mosquito repellent. Students were divided into three grade categories: K-3, 4-6 and 7-12.

The winning entries were based on: creativity, originality and the ability to effectively communicate one or more of the District D's of Mosquito Prevention. Twelve winners were selected by a panel of judges.

We are proud to share that 6th grade student Kaylie Bui's artwork was chosen out of almost 1,500 entries the agency received as a winning entry! As a 2nd place winner, Kaylie won a check for \$100 and a \$200 check was awarded to the school and her teacher, Ms. Engstrom.

And this is an interesting fact: current 6th grade student Thadeus Kim was a 2nd place winner of the same contest last year, as a 5th grader! Golden Empire has some impressive artists! Congratulations, Kaylie!



Thank You To Our Leader in Me Review Day Leaders!



Wednesday, May 20 was a busy, virtual day. This was our Leader in Me (LIM) Lighthouse Virtual Review Day! What is a Lighthouse School? Within the education industry, it is common for schools to receive recognition for outstanding achievement. The Lighthouse Certification is a highly-regarded standard that is attainable by every Leader in Me school. As it is a significant benchmark, applying for this certification typically occurs four to five years after a school begins the Leader in Me process. The certification is evidence that a school has produced

outstanding results in school and student outcomes by implementing the Leader in Me process with excellence. It is also because of the extraordinary impact that the school has on its staff, students, parents, and the greater community.

The review, which is normally conducted by 2 LIM outside reviewers who visit the campus, had to be completed virtually this year due to the pandemic. Therefore the reviewers had to meet with the parent and student panels virtually, via Zoom. These panels are a crucial part of the review day, as parents and students must be interviewed about the effectiveness of the LIM process.

As of today, we are still awaiting to hear of our certification, but we are keeping our fingers crossed that the result will be a positive one!
