It is our goal that STRIDE will help students maintain a healthy and active lifestyle while encouraging them to develop a connection between fitness and fun. All students in 1<sup>st</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup> grade have the opportunity to complete laps during their lunch breaks every week. Our school goal is for students to run 17,584 cumulative miles - the distance to Madagascar! ## **Medication on Campus**



If your child needs to take over the counter medication or a prescription, a medication form filled out by the doctor and parent must be completed. This form is available in the school office. All medication must be in the container in which it was purchased. This includes

cough drops, ibuprofen, and cold medication. It must be delivered straight to the office and given to office staff. The medical staff may fax the form to the school at 916.228.5838.



## Remember to Sign-In When Entering the Instructional Area

Keeping safety at the forefront at Golden Empire, remember to always sign-in at the front office before entering the school grounds during school hours. Most of our families are well aware of this policy, but it is just a good reminder, as this policy is enforced by Penal Code 627.2. This regulation is to ensure our students and staff are always safe, and to ensure we always know who is on campus in case of an emergency. When you sign in, we will be asking you to wear a visitor's label showing that you have registered in the office. Golden Empire is in the 3<sup>rd</sup> year of implementing the Leader in Me (LIM) program where students are taught and practice the 7 Me (LIM) program where students are target and Habits of Highly Effective People. LIM empowers young people to make positive, effective, and responsible choices by introducing and reinforcing the 7 Habits, a set of leadership and life skills from Stephen Covey's book The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People. The LIM provides students with activities that will help them learn practical character and life skills that will lead to those positive choices.

Your student is embarking on an exciting journey and our hope is that you will ask your student how he/she is doing along the way. Having your student re-teach the content to you will give him/her an even deeper understanding and will give both of you an opportunity to learn together! When taught and practiced in a school environment, these 7 habits have been proven to improve academic engagement, comprehension, and performance by strengthening individual work habits and improving social interactions. They help improve student performance and support school success by helping to foster the qualities of independence (goal-setting, organization, time management, and planning); interdependence (teamwork, conflict management, creativity, and analytical skills); and renewal (fun, desire to learn, and good health & hygiene).

The staff at Golden Empire has made the commitment to model and implement the 7 Habits of Highly Effective People in order to provide a caring and nurturing learning environment for our students. Teaching students and developing leaders is what we do! Through the teaching of the 7 habits, our staff is working together with students to create a school that maintains the dignity of children through productive interactions while fostering positive relationships with parents and other community members.

Each month we will focus on one of the seven habits to help our families become more familiar with the habits. Be on the lookout for the next informational Habit flier!
