

there every morning to assist in opening car doors and ensuring students are safe. The **Pick-Up Zone** for use at dismissal time is at the very front of the school, near the Bus Zone. Bringing the 7 Habits Home!

The Leader In Me at Golden Empire is our method to instill in our scholars, teachers, staff, and families the culture of personal and public leadership. The core of Leader In Me is the 7 Habits of Highly Effective People as outlined by Steven R. Covey. As the school year unfolds, the students will learn the language and meaning of the 7 Habits.

We encourage our families to complete a Habit at Home form, seen like this one, here. The forms can be found in the office or are also sent home periodically throughout the year. Parents complete the form indicating how their child(ren) demonstrated one (or more!) of the 7 Habits. Have your student return the form to school to receive a Golden Ticket and have their form displayed on our board in the main school hallway. It's rewarding and fun!

By hearing the same 7 Habit language at home and at school, we send the student leaders a strong message of what we believe is important and that we are all on the same team – the team that wants to help each student succeed. As the school and family connect in support of one another, our students will succeed beyond our wildest expectations! Thank you for teaming with us!

What Is i-Ready? i-Ready is an interactive online learning program designed to provide individualized instruction based on each child's unique needs.

i-Ready Diagnostic: i-Ready starts with a test that determines every student's academic skills in math and reading. This test is adaptive, which means that the level of difficulty will change as your child answers each question. Questions get a little harder each time a question is answered correctly, and a little easier when answered incorrectly. The goal is to figure out the math or reading level that is "just right" for your child, so your child should expect to see some questions that are too hard—and that's okay! It means the test is working correctly.

The results of the test will help your child's teachers identify exactly where your child needs to develop, as well as where his or her strengths are. Teachers can use this information to design individualized instruction that meets the unique needs of your child. And because the test is taken a few times throughout the school year, your child's teacher will be able to measure progress and growth over the course of the year.

i-Ready Instruction: i-Ready provides students digital instruction that meets them where they are—at their level. It allows them to work independently on their own personalized online instruction plan, in lessons that are assigned based on the results from the i-Ready Diagnostic test.

Students complete the lessons in the computer lab or in their classroom. The lessons include three parts, consisting of a tutorial, guided practice, and a graded activity. This exciting format and engaging content draws students in right away. Students get supportive, real-time feedback on their progress in each skill; they see motivating messages and earn credits after completing lessons, which builds their investment in learning.



Your Student Can Work on i-Ready at Home! Follow these steps:

1. Go to SCUSD.edu
2. Click on Parent/Student
3. Click on Online Tools
4. Click on Clever

There are 2 ways to sign in to i-Ready:

1. Log in with a Clever badge (Grades K-3 only): Click Clever, hold your badge up to the camera on your computer for this to work.
2. Log in with Google (for all students*): Use your student google account log-in (firstname-lastname@student.scusd.edu) and your password.

*All students in grades 4-6 need to use their Google log-in which they should all know by now.

Golden Empire's 4H Farm Day *A Special Contribution by 6th Grade Student Maxton Creeger*

On October 29, 2019, Golden Empire students had the opportunity to listen to members of the 4H Club as they discussed animals. It was a very enjoyable time back near the garden as leaders learned about guinea pigs, rabbits, miniature horses and saddles, dog breeds, and birds such as chickens and a turkey.

In the first two sections of the tour, 4H members showed GE Eagles their guinea pigs and rabbits. A brave member explained and showed three different guinea pig breeds. The breeds included the American, Abyssian, and Peruvian guinea pigs. She gave facts on the guinea pigs and how to take care of them. At the rabbit station members showed students three rabbits and how to take care of them. A student recalled an interesting fact that carrots are bad for rabbits! Wow!

Along with guinea pigs and rabbits, leaders learned about the saddle and miniature horse. Two members showed parts of the saddle including the horn, stirrups, and bit. They experienced the “very graceful” jump of a miniature horse along with picking up a few facts.

The guinea pigs, rabbits, miniature horse, and saddle were all great subjects of learning, but don't forget the last two! GE Eagles were informed about different dog breeds/groups and more about the turkey and chickens. A volunteer talked about different groups of dog such as the herding, sporting, non-sporting, toy terrier, hound, and working groups. Other experts gave us information on the chicken and turkey.

GE students had a great experience and got to learn more about animals, objects, and farms. “Just a great overall experience and time,” said leader Maxton Creeger, who had the privilege of enjoying the wonderful day. What fun!



To Be a Yard Supervisor at Golden Empire!

Interested in helping our students during recess times? Do you want to help keep our students safe? If so, a substitute yard supervisor position may be for you. We are accepting applications for this paid position for the 2019-2020 school year. Please stop in the school office to inquire.

Medications in School

The District and Golden Empire Staff recognize that students may have special medical needs. The Education Code (49407) outlines conditions for administering medications at school during the time the student is under the supervision of school personnel. Medication prescribed may be administered during the school day by designated school personnel. Medications, both prescription and over-the-counter, can only be given if there are written instructions from a health care provider and written permission from the parent/guardian. Upon request, a form will be provided to the parent for completion by the attending doctor and parent. Written instructions must be renewed at the start of each school year.

All prescription medications must:

- Be brought to school by the parent.
- Come in the original container with the prescription label attached.

Asthma

If your child requires use of an inhaler at school, whether it is used for emergencies or on a daily basis, it must be left in the office. This allows school personnel to monitor and supervise all inhaler treatments and prevents the transporting of medication on the school bus or use in the classroom HOWEVER, if your doctor states that your child may keep the inhaler on his/her person, then we will accommodate this request. All inhalers require a medical authorization form.
